




FROM THE PASTOR





MISSION COMMITTEE


The Mission Committee for the year of 2024 distributed funds to many ministries here at home and at large. Global Mission giving for 2024 came to \$3,300. Local Mission Giving for 2024 added up to \$3,050.

The Mission program is sustained in part by gifts from the Myers Sisters bequest as well as gifts from members. You can designate gifts to "Local Mission" or "Global Mission".

The Deacon's Shoe Ministry: Distributed 37 pairs of shoes for the year of 2024. With each pair of shoes we also deliver 3 pairs of socks.

Food Pantry: The food pantry has handed out **700** bags of food for the year of 2024.





What is Epiphany?

Epiphany is on January 6th, which is twelve days after Christmas. This is the amount of time that spans the birth of Jesus, and according to tradition when the magi visited Mary, Joseph, and their child. Epiphany doesn't always fall on a Sunday, so the Church celebrates it on the nearest Sunday (January 5, 2025), called "Epiphany Sunday".

The Greek word *epiphany* simply means "to reveal" or "to make manifest." It was the name given by early Christians to celebrate the birth of Jesus, the revelation of God's love to the world (<u>John 3:16</u>). An annual festival would follow to celebrate and recognize that Jesus, the Son of God, reveals God's plan to save the world.





Statewide Presbyterian Wednesday Devotion Invitation
