



FROM THE PASTOR

As the Joplin tornado of 2011 lifted, the stories began... stories of butterflies, butterfly people or angels that protected children from the storm. The stories were many and miraculous but very believable when set against the backdrop of the physical devastation caused by the storm. The stories spread rapidly and gave people peace and hope to a community so badly hurt. While there were many different accounts, the following three are representative of the miracle that happened on May 22, 2011.

A father laid on top of his daughter in the yard grasping at the grass to keep them both down. His shoes were pulled from his feet but when the storm lifted and they were both unharmed, his daughter simply said "Daddy, it was OK, a butterfly was holding us down."

A young girl was lifted into the air by the storm, but a butterfly quickly wrapped its wings around her and brought her safely to the ground.

Without a scratch, a child in a car seat emerged from a car filled with glass and debris. When safe from the wreckage, the child described a butterfly wrapping its wings around him, protecting and making him feel safe.

The butterfly, a symbol of Jesus' resurrection, can remind us of the care that Jesus offers to each one of us. Be grateful for protection. Offer protection to others in the name of Jesus. And offer a prayer of joy each time you encounter a butterfly this Spring.

Easter Lilies Symbolism

Easter lilies, with their white color and trumpet shape, are traditionally associated with purity, rebirth, and hope, particularly in the Christian context, symbolizing the resurrection of Jesus.

Purity and Innocence:

The white color of the Easter lily is a common symbol of purity and innocence, often associated with the purity of Christ.

• Rebirth and Resurrection:

The Easter lily's growth cycle, from a dormant bulb to a vibrant flower, is seen as symbolic of the resurrection, echoing the Christian belief in Jesus's rising from the dead.

Hope:

The trumpet shape of the Easter lily is said to represent a trumpet sounding the message that Jesus has risen, symbolizing hope and new beginnings.

• • Springtime:

As a flower that blooms in the spring, the Easter lily is also associated with the renewal and rebirth of nature, which aligns with the Christian concept of spiritual rebirth.

• • Christian Tradition:

Easter lilies are a common sight in churches during Easter celebrations, often adorning altars and symbolizing the resurrection of Jesus.

The Mission Committee did not meet during March.

The Mission program is sustained in part by gifts from the Myers Sisters bequest as well as gifts from members. You can designate gifts to "Local Mission" or "Global Mission".

The Deacon's Shoe Ministry: Distributed 2 pairs of shoes for the year of 2025. With each pair of shoes we also deliver 3 pairs of socks.

Food Pantry: The food pantry has served 14 households and 24 individuals from March 1 - March 20.



Malawi Mission Offering

With the loss of USAID funding, the Synod of Livingstonia has had to curtail much of its Health Ministry. Particularly hard-hit are programs that prevent and treat Tuberculosis and HIV, along with much of the pharmaceutical distribution system. The Presbytery of Eastern Oklahoma and challenged each congregation to participate in a special Offering for Malawi. Our congregation will accept donations on April 27th and May 4th.
